Spring Book Fair - March 27 - 31

- Really terrific book fair ran the week of March 27th. Kids and families enjoyed greatly.
- Tried to make the fair equitable, created a fund to support kids who did not have funds to purchase books. There was a lot of miscommunication as many kids thought they could all get free books, even if they brought their own money.
- Many parents donated to the fund

- Need more communication and volunteers particularly in the younger grades.
- Could we get Middle School students help volunteer at the Book Fair?
- Way understaffed with volunteers. Might be good to sync up the volunteer time slot that their child will be attending the Fair with their class. Will need to coordinate communication from teachers about when their class will visit the fair.
- Karen McGroaty will take the lead on this next year, taking over for Erin Payne, whose 8th grader is graduating Peirce this year.
- Karen will hold a meeting to discuss the vision for the next book fair in the fall.
- Would be great to have a Book Donation / Swap event, whether connected to Book Fair or not. Perhaps this could be part of Literacy Night.

Parent - Teacher Conference Luncheon - Wednesday March 29

- This event went very well. Set up was great. Feedback from teachers great. Lots of appreciation for the hot food.
- Food catered from Mariano's. Could have used maybe 2 more entrees, more chicken.
- Total raised \$1700 from parent donations for the school year. Spent \$694 from this fund for the December luncheon, and \$522 for this luncheon this spring. There is a balance of \$369 left in this fund.
